

The following information was acquired from Lisa at NY Board of Elections- Staten Island Office.

**1. Placement on the ballot** of the NY Constitutional Convention referendum proposal **has not been determined yet.**

- a. This will be determined after the September primary
- b. Generally it is on the back
- c. Not sure yet if it will be on the front or back of the ballot

2. At every voting poll the proposal will be posted and available to be read even if the referendum is placed on the rear of the ballot.

**3. If you do not vote on the referendum it will NOT be counted**

- a. It does not count period.**
- b. Passage of the referendum is determined by the number of yes or no votes. By not voting will NOT affect the vote outcome.**

**4. Prior to Election Day, 2 weeks before;**

- a. Newspapers will print the voting ballot so everyone can read it.
- b. Everyone should have knowledge of the proposal
- c. It is state law to make the entire ballot available for review.
- d. After the September primary, the referendum proposal will be available online for review.

**The National Executive Boards' position is VOTE NO regarding the New York Constitutional Convention. We strongly advise all members to inform their family and friends who live in New York to VOTE NO to the proposed Constitutional Convention.**

A Constitutional Convention will be good to some voters who want changes, however, the wide open nature of the convention could result in the loss of some existing rights, including changes to our pension, health care, bargaining rights, etc.
