High above mid-Manhattan, atop the 200-foot S.C.A. Tower, the 500-pound Victory Siren is mounted. It is operated by New York Firemen. Its mighty voice, operated by a 140 H.P. gasoline motor, radiates within a 3-mile radius. It is one of the City's 4 super-sirens.
